The Pandemics, The Promise, The Plan: A Litany

We have come to Columbus as the church gathered. Till yesterday, we were the church scattered, situated on five continents in 39 countries. We have gathered under the theme, "The Pandemics, The Promise, The Plan." We arrived with our historic theological mantra, spoken in many tongues, "God our Father, Christ our Redeemer, Holy Spirit our Comforter, Humankind our Family."

People: A thousand afflictions to vex our souls, yet we are the Church first things First —

we are called to Worship.

Leader: In the Pandemic, we could not meet. We stood by yawning graves waiting to receive the remains of loved ones, friends and colleagues. Never once did we think to say, "This is the work of a hoax." The Pandemic was real — airborne— as easy to contract as inhaling — breathing what was expected to be fresh air.

People: A thousand afflictions to vex our souls, yet we are the Church, we are called to Pray.

Leader: The Pandemic has been real, relentless and nearly intractable — and so are racism, fascism, ageism, xenophobia, hate, gun violence, police brutality, gender discrimination, voter suppression, economic disparities, and War. Metaphorically, they are in the air we breathe. Some have whispered, "I can't breathe." Together, they are killing our institutions, our relationships, our trust.

People: A thousand afflictions to vex our souls, yet we are the Church; we are called to Civic and Political Engagement.

Leader:

The retelling of the big lie and living in denial will not change the facts in America: teaching true history is being stifled; Gang Violence and Anarchy are rife in Haiti, and so is Human Trafficking, and the Displacement of thousands in Central Africa, Human Suffering in Gaza, abject poverty apparent in too many places. Democracy is endangered. Climate change is real.

People: A thousand afflictions to vex our souls, yet we are the Church, we are called to Vigilance; we are called to Vote.

Leader: We confess that our fellowship has been fractured. Some feel betrayed and injured, a

circumstance with the potential to tear us apart, fragmented and feeble. Was the Vision

given to our venerable founder merely myopic?

People: A thousand afflictions to vex our souls, yet we are the Church, we are called to Hope.

Leader: We are the heirs of Richard and Sarah Allen, and a great cloud of witnesses who preceded

us since 1787 and 1816. We are beneficiaries of their vision and mantra of Salvation, Liberation and Education, a global ministry under the banner of Jesus, the Living Lord,

and the African Methodist Episcopal Church.

People: A thousand afflictions to vex our souls, yet we are the Church, we are called to Stand

for the cause of Justice, in every corner of the world; we are called to Go.

Leader: "In the world you will have tribulation," Jesus said, "but be of good cheer, I have

overcome the world." "Do not be afraid. Lo, I am with you."
